

Mother of millions - *Bryophyllum delagoense* and similar species

Form: Erect little-branched succulent waxy annual herbs 0.5-1m tall.

Leaves: Succulent, grey to green or mottled, varying from tubular to strongly V-shaped depending on species, with pegs at leaf tips or along edges. Plantlets develop on the pegs and fall readily, soon growing into new plants.

Flowers: Winter. Conspicuous clusters of tubular 2-3cm long orange to red flowers at the tops of stems.

Fruits: Chaffy and brown, but seeds probably of little significance.

Impacts: Highly visible exotic. Several related garden species.

Control: Pull up, bag and remove plants including plantlets. Spot spray. See DPI Fact Sheet for current herbicide recommendations.

Ongoing management: Check area every year and control new and regenerating plants.
